# Royal London announce Ireland rugby player Aoibheann Reilly as Brand Ambassador ahead of inaugural Women's Lions Tour

Following the announcement of the first-ever Lions Women's tour, set to take place in 2027 in New Zealand, Royal London has announced **Aoibheann Reilly** as the organisation's new brand ambassador.

The Ballinasloe native currently plays for Blackrock RFC and is one of the three players who played a role in winning Ireland women's 7s first-ever World Series title in Perth earlier this year. Aoibheann is currently part of the Ireland team competing in this year's Women's Guinness Six Nations Championship.

This partnership is a further testament to Royal London's commitment to championing and supporting women's rugby, and to making a difference by helping to level the playing field for this and future generations.

## Speaking of her new role as brand ambassador Aoibheann said,

"I'm delighted to announce that I've become an ambassador for Royal London and Royal London Ireland. Aoibheann has experienced first-hand the positive impact of women playing sport together and driving each other to be the best they can be.

Aoibheann's passion for sport is also reflected in her ambitions off the pitch as she studied performance science in UCD and currently works at Output Sports.

Following the success of the 2023 Royal London funded feasibility study into a Lions Women's tour, Royal London has recently been announced as founding partner of the Lions Women's team.
